Responsibilities of NMIS in Keeping the Meat You Eat Safe

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In slaughterhouses, the Meat Inspection Officer (from NMIS or LGU) will check these requirements before accepting live animals for slaughter



For hogs



For large animals
(please include these two)

*Veterinary Health Certificate
*Shipping Permit

*Certificate of ownership
*Transfer Certificate

If requirements are complete, the MI will accept the animals and conduct ante-mortem inspection.

Ante-mortem inspection is screening of all animals destined to be slaughtered.

Note: If during the inspection, an animal is suspected to have a disease, it will not be slaughtered.

If the animal passes the ante-mortem inspection, it will undergo slaughtering procedures.



SLAUGHTER

After animals are slaughtered, its carcasses will undergo post-mortem inspection.

Post-mortem inspection is the examination made to carcass, head and viscera after slaughtering and dressing.

Note: If during the post-mortem inspection, a carcass is suspected to have a disease, it will be condemned

NMIS

The Meat Inspection Officer will release a Meat Inspection Certificate to all slaughtered animals or carcasses that passed the post-mortem inspection.

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
